Greetings to you in this last week of the first term. Thank you to everyone for the collosal effort that has been involved in keeping us all in school all term here at Manawa Tapu! What a challenging term this has been on many levels and I hope you will all take the opportunity to rest and refresh in these school holidays.

Writing to you in Holy Week, we are mindful of the Easter message and reflect on God's love for us. This week in Manaaki groups we have participated in a Washing of the Feet Liturgy; taking time to consider Jesus' example of servant leadership, love, compassion and forgiveness. Now that New Zealand has moved to the Covid-19 Protection Framework Orange setting, we have updated our school protocols. Holy Week

Holy Week is the most important week in the Church year. It is a time when we celebrate in a special way the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. We remember his actions, reflect on his messages and recommit to living as his disciples in the world today.

The final week of Lent, Holy Week begins with <u>Palm Sunday</u> and concludes with the <u>Triduum</u>. On <u>Palm Sunday</u> we remember how Jesus was welcomed into Jerusalem by the people with cheers and palms. A symbol of victory, palms were used on special occasions to welcome heroes and royalty.

<u>Triduum</u> comes from two Latin words – *tres* and *dies* – that mean "a space of three days," beginning at sundown on <u>Holy Thursday</u> with the Mass of the Lord's Supper, continuing with the <u>Good Friday</u> afternoon commemoration of the Lord's Passion and concluding at sundown on <u>Easter Sunday</u>. Its high point is the celebration of the Resurrection at the <u>Easter Vigil</u>.

During the Triduum, we celebrate the core mystery of our Catholic faith: we ritualize Jesus' transition from life to death to risen life, and our own participation in God's divine plan of salvation. We must pass over our lives into God's hands and imitate the self-giving of God's Son. This is the way to new life. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!



Unwell?

1. If you're sick, stay at home.

GREEN

- 2. If you become sick at school, we'll arrange for you to be isolated, and then to go home.
- 3. If you develop flu-like symptoms, caregivers are to contact GP or Healthline 0800 358 5453.
- 4. If you're unable to come to school, access your learning materials on Microsoft TEAMS.

Safety and Hygiene

- 1. Face masks are no longer mandatory, but are strongly encouraged to be worn at school when indoors.
- 2. Face mask wearing is mandatory on school and public bus services.
- 3. Sensibly social distance; no touch; no shared breath.
- 4. Maintain basic hygiene; includes good hand hygiene, cough, and sneeze etiquette, avoid touching your face, and regularly clean and disinfect surfaces.
- 5. Use hand sanitiser provided when entering and leaving classrooms and shared spaces.

- 1. School finishes at **3.20pm on Mondays** and finishes at **3.00pm Tuesday-Friday** while in Orange.
- School and Deans Assemblies will be held at 2pm on Mondays and will follow health and safety guidelines.

This is the pastoral process our Manaaki teachers use if there is an attendance or uniform issue:

Student is not meeting expectations	Low level restorative chat. The student is reminded of the expectations.
Not resolved	Expectations are revisited – The teachers makes a note in the student management system.
Not resolved	Teacher contacts home and makes a note in the student management system.
Not resolved	The teacher refers the issue to the year level dean.

We really appreciate the role caregivers have and the support they provide in helping our students meet Manawa Tapu's behavioural expectations.
